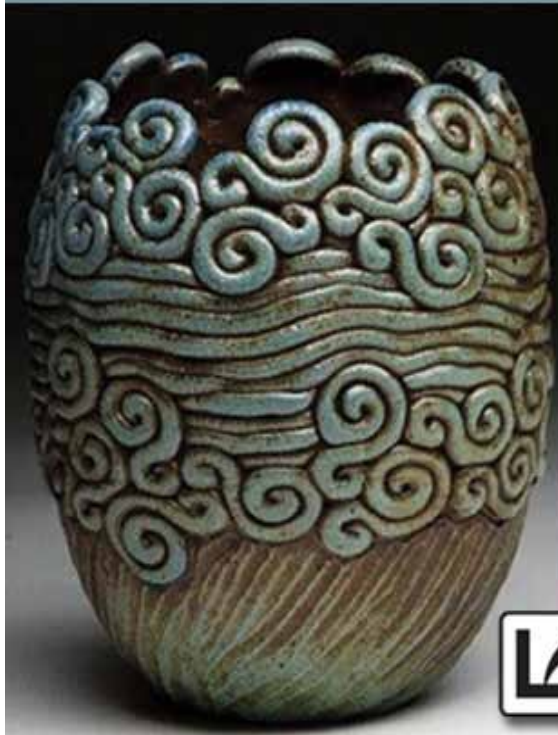

## LAA Mini Workshop: Clay Handbuilding: Coil Construction



with **Edward deMahy**  
**Saturday, May 21st • 10am-3pm**

Coil building is the simple process of layering coils or other shapes, one at a time, then welding the layers together to create a solid form. An extremely versatile technique, coils are good for making larger pottery. In this workshop, you'll have the opportunity to build 2 coil constructed objects: a lidded vessel, platter, or vase. A convenient time in the following week will be scheduled for you to glaze your work at Edward's studio (where he'll do the firing). Pick up of finished work will be at the LAA upon notification. Tools and supplies for the workshop are provided.
