GREAT NEWS!
The Oil Center has been designated a Cultural Arts District which means YOUR original art will be 4% less expensive for purchase.

This is certainly a big plus for LAA! Only original art is eligible for this exemption from parish sales tax. What defines original art for this exemption?

- Visual art or fine craft
- Not mass produced
- Original
- Made by hand
- One-of-a-kind

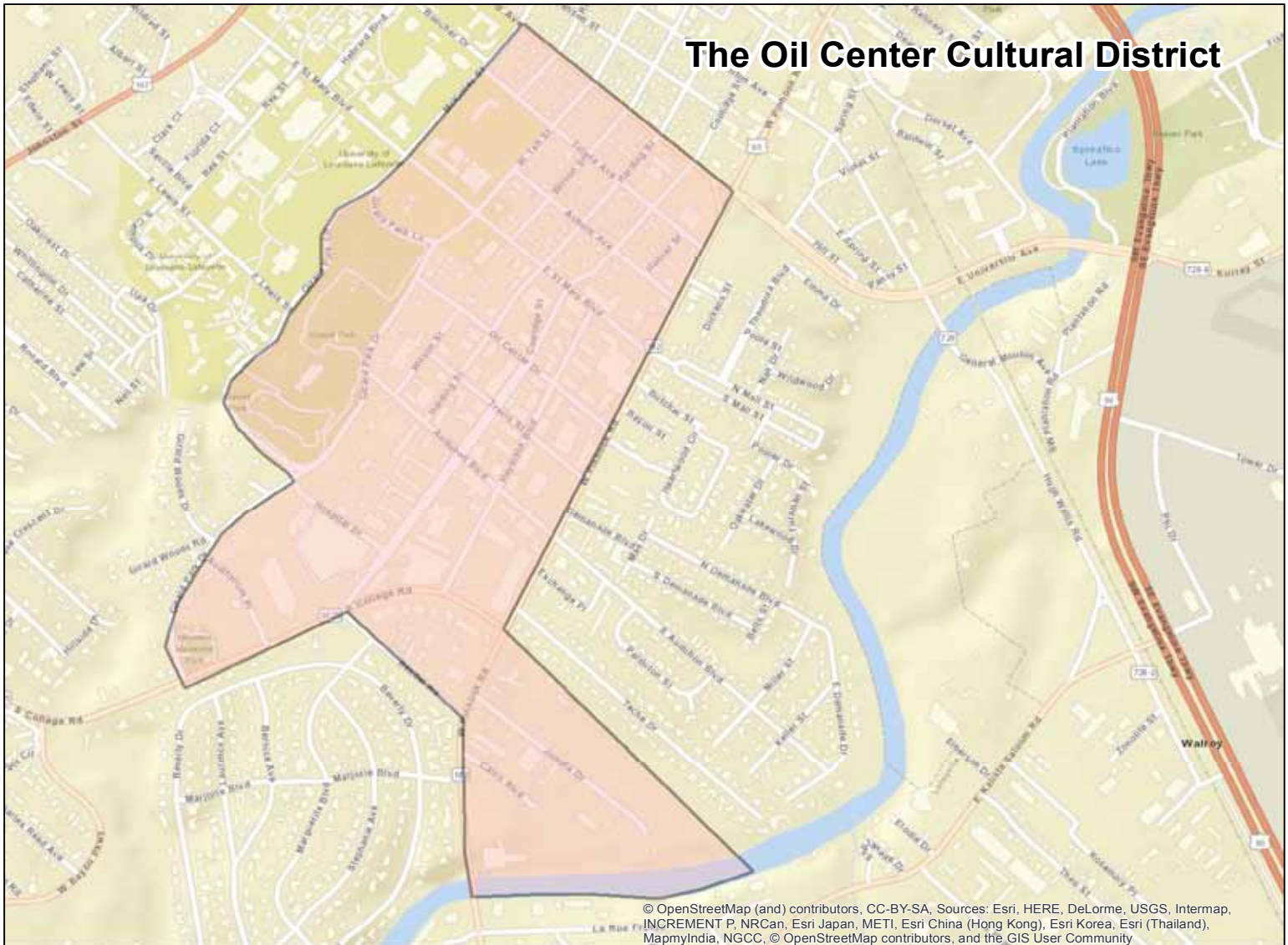
As this is a mandatory statute, LAA will comply by requesting each artist submitting work for exhibits and the boutique to complete, and sign, the required certificate of original art.

Exhibits at City Hall, Main Library, and Vermilionville are ineligible for this exemption. Pouparts is in a separate Cultural Arts District, so the certificate must also be completed for those exhibits, as well.

There are additional detailed qualifications of original art which will be made available for all artists submitting. A detailed procedure for

recording and reporting exempt art is in development by the LAA treasurer. LAA will also be meeting with the government representative to discuss how to maximize publicity and community awareness of this new benefit for our artists.

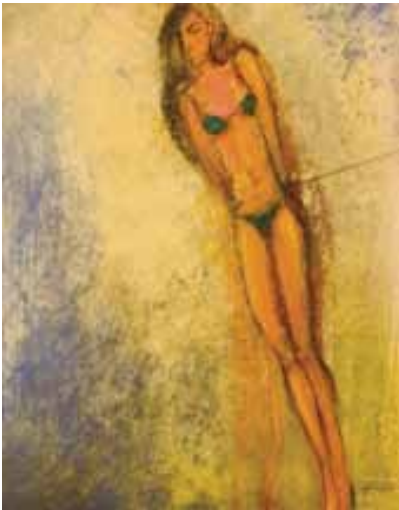

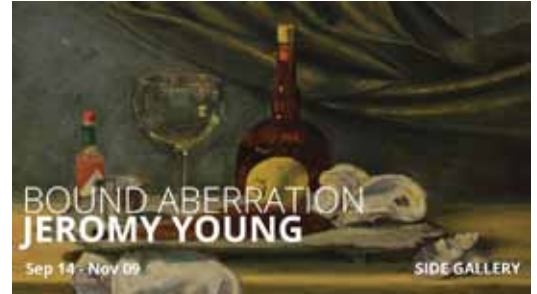


CONGRATS TO:

Once again, the LAA is proud to be a part of the Open Studio Tours, 2019 November 23rd & 24th

The Louisiana Crafts Guild (LCG) is partnering with the Lafayette Art Association, the Lafayette Conventions and Visitors Bureau, and the Lafayette Economic Development Authority to provide a fun, educational, and enriching weekend of fine art and craft. Visit 100+ artists at 30+ sites to see and learn about their work. Many of our member artists will be a part of the tour. Visit www.openstudioacadiana.com for more information and to get an interactive map, studio listings, artists bios and photos. Visitors can find brochures at the Lafayette Welcome Center, the Sans Souci Fine Crafts Gallery, and the Lafayette Art Association. The Studio Tours will be open from 10am until 5pm on Saturday, 11/23 and noon until 5pm on Sunday, 11/24. The public will be invited to roam freely from one studio to another visiting as many studios as they would like. There will be one or more artists demonstrating their work at each location. Many artists will have work for sale at their studio for visitors to purchase. Some locations will have visiting artists.

A Little Bit of Tour History

The Open Studio Tours began back in 1971 when a group of ten artists decided to organize a way for the general public to see their works, both finished and in progress. They wanted not only to display their art, but to also show how those works were produced. Thus, the first Open Studio Tour was born. **Among those first ten artists to open their workshops to the public were George Rodrigue, Rollin Tyrell, and Sara Parker.** Rodrigue was a young artist at the time, very pre-Blue Dog, and his work was

described as depicting dark rural Louisiana landscapes. Although his Blue Dogs became wildly popular later in his career, his older works are also treasured. Some of them were undoubtedly on display on that first Tour, and very likely purchased by early collectors. Rollin Tyrell was a craftsman who did aluminum castings. His sculptures were often abstract in nature, and were one of a kind because of assorted extraneous objects when modelling the molten aluminum. Suzanne and Pat Juneau are among the local collectors who have samples of works. Tyrell is the grandfather of sculptor Kelly Guidry of Breaux Bridge, who begins his works with the help of a chainsaw. Kelly will be on the Tour, and he chaired the 2003-2005 Tours. Sara Parker, the only surviving artist from the original Tour, is still producing wonderful watercolors, despite being "of a certain age." Her works have an oriental flavor and serenity to them, and in the words of one collector, "They have a very calming effect on me." One of her many fans might have purchased a painting from her on that first Tour, or gotten to observe her technique on a work in progress.

...The Tours were held annually over the years, with the occasional hiatus as the artists and craftsmen sometimes failed to agree on how the Tours should be handled, and volunteers were hard to find. The latest hiatus ended three years ago when the Louisiana Craft Guild and the Lafayette Art Association joined forces to reactivate the Tours.

Under the leadership of Burnell Lemoine, and with the cooperation and assistance of the Craft Guild, the Lafayette Art Association, the participating artists and craftsmen and a host of volunteers, the 2016 and the 2017 Tours were a huge success, and the 2018 Tour promises to be even bigger and better. In preparing for the 2018 tour, Tour Chairman Lemoine expressed his gratitude to everyone involved, and particularly recognized the help provided by the Lafayette Conventions and Visitors Commission, the Louisiana Economic Development Authority, Right Angle Advertising, St. Landry Bank, IberiaBank, American Bank & Trust Company, and the Acadiana Center for the Arts.
