President's Blurb

Simone, my wife, my inspiration and sometimes butt kicker, was kind enough to give me a swift kick start for this message with a quote from one of our favorite authors, Neil Gaiman (an English author. his works include the comic book series The Sandman and novels Stardust. American Gods. Coraline. and The Graveyard Book). Although I haven't read this particular piece of literature* (I intend to) here is a quote from it that I find fits the times and says many things I want to say:

"Life is sometimes hard. Things go wrong, in life and in love and in business and in friendship and in health and in all other ways that life can go wrong. And when things get tough, this is what you should do. Make good art." From Make Good Art.

Neil isn't an art instructor and isn't telling you how to perform that brush stroke, mix those hues, combine those parts or even how to sing those notes. He's telling you to use those emotions that come with hard times to create. Create good, emotional, meaningful ART. When you feel like breaking something, break the rules. When you feel like screaming, let the scream come through your imagination into an image and when you feel like crying let the tears flow into a sea of creation. And do it now. There's one more quote from "Make Good Art" I'd like to leave you with:

"The one thing you have that nobody else has is you. Your voice, your mind, your story, your vision. So write and draw and build and play and dance and live as only you can. The moment that you feel that just possibly you are walking down the street naked...that's the moment you may be starting to get it right."

So, let's get it right this year... and I don't mean walking down the street naked.



Besides ribbon awards there will be monetary awards for (1) 1st place winner per each of the (5) categories and (1) Best of Show.

Categories: Black & White; Color/Enhanced; Wildlife/Nature; Portrait; and Landscape/Architectural Entry fee for 1-3 entries: \$15 for LAA members and \$30 for non LAA Members.

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FREEZE FRAME PHOTOGRAPHIC CATEGORIES

BLACK & WHITE CODE: BW

Black and White prints that have only a range of shades of gray from white to black. No color is allowed. Sepia or toning processes are acceptable. Any subject is accepted. Note: All images presented in Black and White do not have to be entered in the Black and White category. The photographer may choose to enter a black and white image in another more appropriate category if the image meets that category's criteria. Example: a black and white image that has a significant portrait component may be entered in the Portrait category.

COLOR/ENHANCED CODE: CE

COLOR: Primary subject is color. Any category allowed except black and white images. ENHANCED: Photographic digital art: images captured by a camera that are then created or drastically altered in any post-processing software such as Adobe Photoshop[®], greatly manipulated with software filters, HDR photos, and photos stitched into a panoramic. Note: digitally manipulated images are also allowed in all categories.

WILDLIFE/NATURE CODE: WN

Primary subject is animal or flower in its natural setting. Zoo or captured animals and insects, and exotic plants grown in a controlled environment such as a horticultural center should not be entered in this category.

PORTRAIT CODE: P

Primary subject is a person or animal. Portraits of insects and flowers also considered.

LANDSCAPE/ARCHITECTURAL CODE: LA

LANDSCAPE: These images showcase outdoor beauty. Primary subject is a tree, river, mountain, etc and the surrounding environment. Includes landscapes, outdoor scenic, sunsets, urban landscapes, seascapes, cityscapes, and farms, etc.

ARCHITECTURAL: Primary subject is a building, part of a building or the interior and furnishings of a building; bridges, towers, windmills, monuments, lampposts, etc.

General Competition Submission Rules and Information For All LAA Shows

ALL submitting artists/photographers are responsible for knowing and following - Please read carefully.

General Rules:

- 1. To be accepted for judging each entry must adhere to all stated entry and mounting/matting requirements.
- 2. Include proper entry fee:
 - a. LAA members: \$15 for 1-3 submitted pieces and \$5 for each additional piece.
 - b. Non-LAA members: \$30 for 1-3 submitted pieces and \$10 for each additional piece .
- 3. Entry fees are non-refundable. Cash, Check, Credit Card or money order for all entries payable to the Lafayette Art Association at the time of entry.
- 4. All submissions must have a completed entry form. Failure to complete the form in its entirety will result in disqualification.
- 5. Previous winning entries will not be accepted to subsequent same-named shows, however, winning entries of one show may be entered in differently named shows.
- 6. The artist's/photographer's name, title of work, category (if applicable) and contact information must be printed on the back of each entry. (adhesive labels are available at the check-in table)
- 7. All entries must be turned in at the LAA office by due date to be accepted. ABSOLUTELY NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THE DEADLINE.
- For judged shows, ribbon awards will be made in each category providing there are an adequate number of entries. The judges can, at their discretion, award in each category (1) First, (1) Second and (1) Third Place. The judges may also award a maximum of 2 Awards of Merit in each category. A Best of Show (1) may also be awarded.

Only (2) shows at this time award monetary awards: Freeze Frame and Eye of the Beholder. Both are Open Competitions. Monetary awards would be given only to Best of Show, and 1st place winners. Monetary awards for 2nd place winners depends on the amount of entry fees collected.

- 9. The judge's and/or Lafayette Art Association decisions are final in all instances.
- 10. The LAA Show Coordinator and Show Committee reserve the right to refuse any entry.
- 11. The LAA retains a 30% commission on any image/item sold. Please price each item to include this commission.
- 12. The LAA will not be responsible for any return costs, insurance or for entries not removed from the gallery within 10 gallery business days.

Framing/Mounting Requirements:

- 1. Any size artwork/photo may be entered (however, gallery height may exclude some pieces). 2-D art must be framed and ready to hang in the LAA gallery.
- 2. The LAA uses a hanging system that requires a wire be firmly affixed to the rear of the frame 1/3 the distance from the top of the frame. An entry frame having only a serrated (alligator or toothed) type hanger will be disqualified. **NO EXCEPTIONS**.
- 3. Gallery wrapped (1.5" min depth) canvases are allowed with a wire placed for hanging as in #2. Screw Eyes must be placed inside the canvas frame and not protrude from back of frame. All unframed wrapped canvases must be painted on the sides and/or have painted image or photographic image wrap to back.
- 4. Mats should be shades of white, gray or black. See #3 for wrapped, unframed canvas requirements.
- 5. Table Top Frames are not accepted as the frame will not fit flush to the wall.
- 6. Always check each show's submission form for requirements that may be specific to that show.
