


New Classes Begin July 7th thru August 11th for 6 weeks

Susan Chiquelin's exhibit, Antlers and Reeds: Contemporary **Basketry** at the Acadiana Center for the Arts in the side gallery, beginning June 4th. Using traditional over/under weaving techniques, Susan innovates her basketry designs using deer antlers found in nature and gifted from hunters. Both her utilitarian and abstract designs incorporate natural and dyed reeds to present unexpected forms, as do the organic lines of the antlers. Through her vision and sensibilities, each piece transforms the ordinary materials into unique works of art.

Watercolor Tip:

New to Watercolor? Here is a way to help you pay attention to values in your paintings: Choose a day of the week when you can just play around with your supplies. Limit yourself to one color - any color and do a small painting. Next week, do a two-color painting, the third week add another color to the mix. These sessions will teach you what is most basic in your artistic endeavors - that the number of colors you use is not what matters. What you should pay attention to is value. Limiting the palette is a simplification that allows one's mind to focus on painting, instead of a bewildering array of color. terrebonnefineartsquild.org/

At The Lafayette Library this summer: Library Museum Pass: Free family admission to 5 museums and historic sites in Lafayette Parish

The Lafayette Public Library is proud to offer the museum pass program that provides **free family admission to five museums and historic sites in Lafayette Parish**. Due to the success of the library's partnership with the Hilliard Art Museum, the museum pass program now includes the following five participating museums:

- Hilliard Art Museum
- Alexandre Mouton
- House/Lafayette Museum
- Children's Museum of Acadiana (limited hours)
- Lafayette Science Museum (weekend hours only)
- Vermilionville Living History
 Museum & Folklife Park

The free family admission pass is currently available for anyone with a valid Lafayette Public

Library card to check out from any library location. The pass is good for a one-time family admission and must be used within seven days of being checked out. Only one pass may be borrowed at a time and the library card holder must be in good standing with the library. (Please Note: The Library Museum Pass will be honored as a regular family admission pass but may not be applicable for certain museum special events.) 
