Exhibit Regulations:

- Maximum of (3) 2D and/or (5) 3D pieces may be entered (for a total of (8) 2- & 3-D pieces max).
- Any size artwork/photo may be entered, however, gallery height may exclude some work.
- 2D Artwork must be framed and ready to hang with wire attached on back, 1/3 of the way from top (wire not to extend past 1" from top of frame). Frames having only a serrated (alligator or toothed) type hanger will be disqualified. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- Gallery wrapped canvases (minimum of 1.5" deep) are allowed with hanging wire on back (same guidelines as frame) and sides must be painted or have image extending around edge. Screw eyes must be placed inside the canvas frame and not protrude from back of canvas frame.
- Shades of white, black or grey mats only on all framed work.
- All submissions must be marked on back or bottom (sticker, card or taped tag) with:
 Artist name, contact info, title (if applicable) and sale price (The LAA retains 30% of any sale).
- All entries not accepted into the show must be picked up at gallery May 19th thru May 21st (noon-5pm) and on May 22nd (10am-2pm). You will be notified by May 19th.
- All work accepted into the Spring Art Exhibit will need to be picked up July 15th thru July 24th.

How To Contribute Your Artist Profile or an Article To The LAA's New Blog

Here are five suggested tips to use for developing your own narrative for an Artist Profile.

Remember to keep it short, sweet, and to the point.

Include a .jpg image of yourself, preferably in an artistic pose or setting.

1. What is Your Background?

Use this question as an opportunity to highlight those aspects of your background that make you and your work unique, with bonus points if you can tie your life experiences to your artwork. Did your upbringing prompt a specific reference point within your work? Is your work informed by certain concepts or themes from your childhood, background, socio-economic status, where you lived or were raised? How does this impact how you see the world and create art?

2. What Is the Intent and Purpose of Your Art?

Why do you make art?

3. Who Are Your Biggest Influences?

Is there a particular artist that inspired you to pursue art? Whose techniques do you study or admire? What genre does your work fall into? Make sure you address why you're infulenced by these artist or artistic movements.

4. What Inspires You?

What connection do you have to your art? What motivates you? Enthusiastically express why you create what you do. How would you express your creativity at work?

4. What Does Your Art Mean to You?

How do you interpret the meaning of your art? Focus solely on your own understanding here because everyone views art differently.

In Brief: Member Artist Bio

Written in first person, a member artist bio is meant to explain who you are as an artist. It should include:

- 1. Information about you
- 2. How you got started
- 3. Important accomplishments
- 4. Information that would:
 Give people a good look into who you are as an artist,
 Give people a greater under standing of your art, your motivation for creating, and also serve as a guide on how to interpret your art.

Three Other Suggested Topic Categories:

Personal Art Stories and Essays

Can be about one of your art pieces:

- 1. What is it about?
- 2. What are the underlying themes or threads?
- 3. How did your theme come about?
- 4. What are the concepts, issues or ideas you have explored here?
- 5. How are they linked in your work?
- 6. What experiences have contributed to the making of this work?

Topics of LAA Interest

These can be of a generalized nature with either direct or indirect value to the mission of LAA. Could be an article you read and found interesting and of value to your art; could be an article written about yourself or an upcoming art event.

Artwork Statement

An Artwork Statement is about your artwork, not about you. It is about the current direction of your work, not a history of how you got to this point. Your 50-word artwork statement may include:

- 1. An outline of the materials and techniques you used to make your artwork.
- 2. Insights into the inspiration for this artwork.
- 3. An explanation of what the artwork is about: details of its themes, story or background.
- 4. Information about when and why you created this artwork, especially ifyou think this will help a viewer's understanding.
- 5. Your intention with this particular artwork.
- 6. Concepts that you are exploring or challenging with this artwork.
